- General science (and mathematics): 2h (3h30)
- Sport: 2h
- OIB English Language & Literature: 4h
- OIB History-Geography: 6h (4h in English + 2h in French)

Special/depth subjects (Spécialités)

Students choose

- 3 in Year 12 (4h per week per subject) and reduce to
- 2 in Year 13 (6h per week per subject) from the list below:
 - » Mathematics
 - » Computer Science
 - » Physics-Chemistry
 - » Life and Earth Sciences (Biology)
 - » Social and Economic Sciences
 - » History-geography, geopolitics and political sciences
 - » Humanities, literature and philosophie
 - » (Foreign language, literature and culture not English)
 - » (Art)
 - » (Engineering Sciences)

Required subject combinations: 3 A levels vs 2 Bac special subjects

- Baccalaureate/OIB/BFI students cannot always offer subject combinations that might be expected (e.g. Maths/ Chemistry/Biology), since they can choose only 2 special subjects for their final year examinations
- Some flexibility in required subject combinations would therefore be appropriate
