

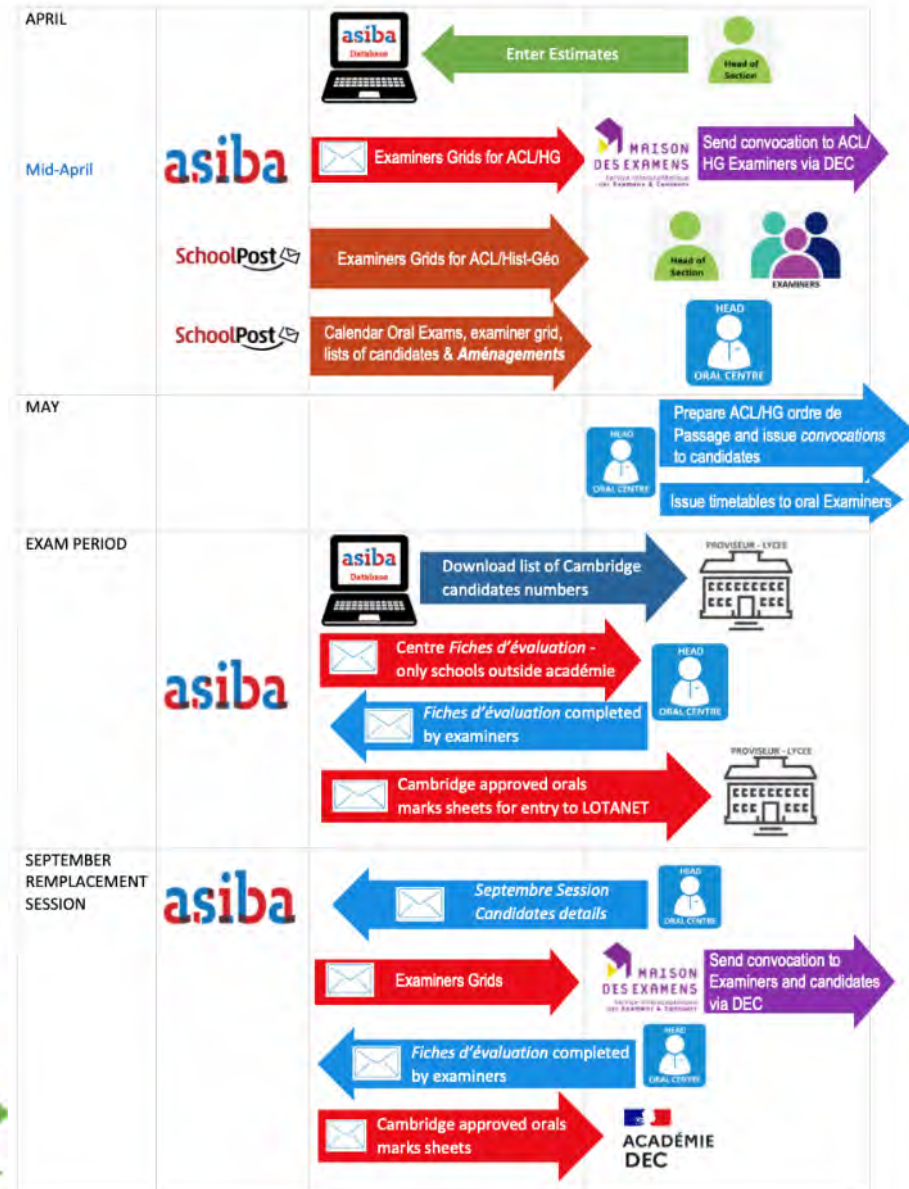
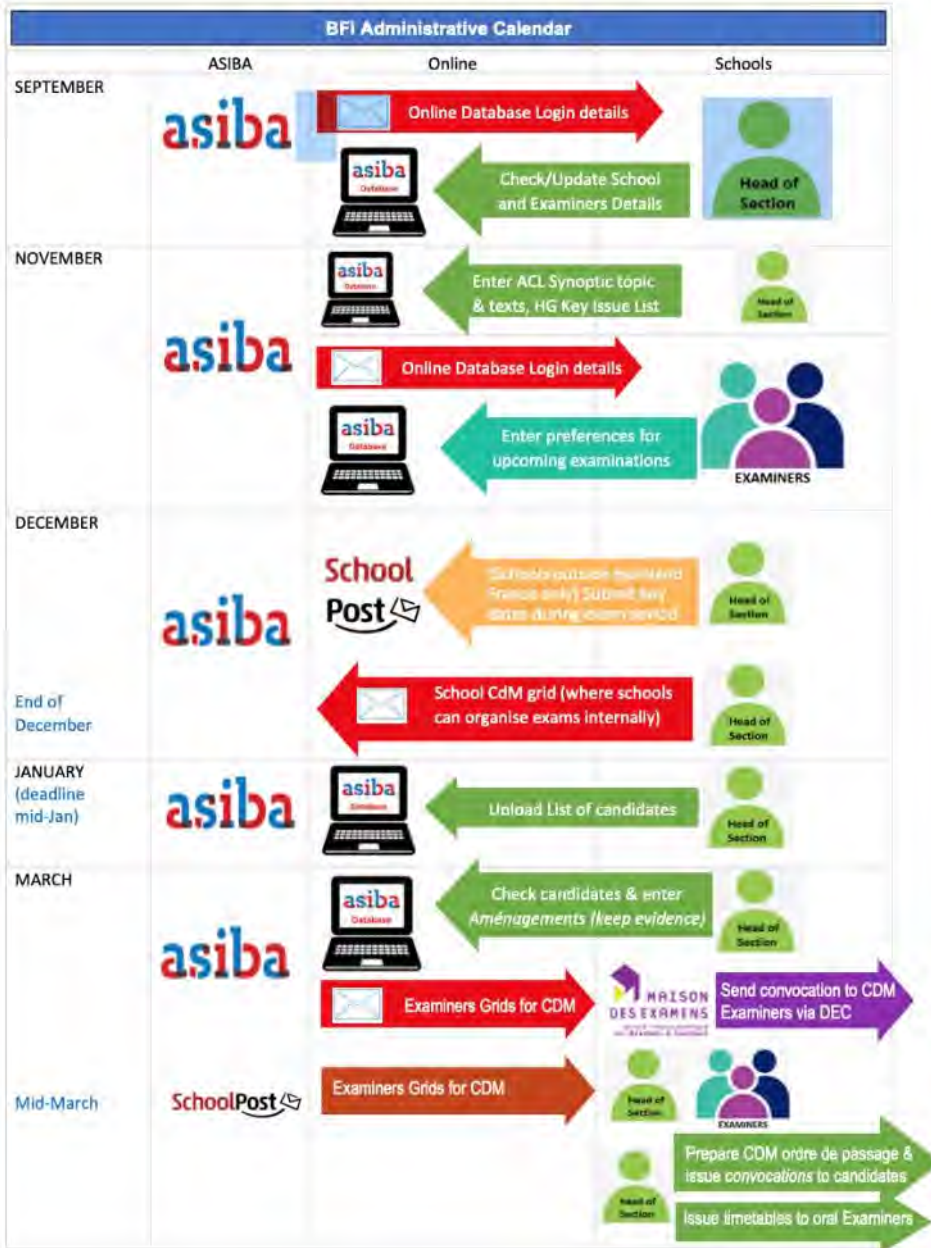

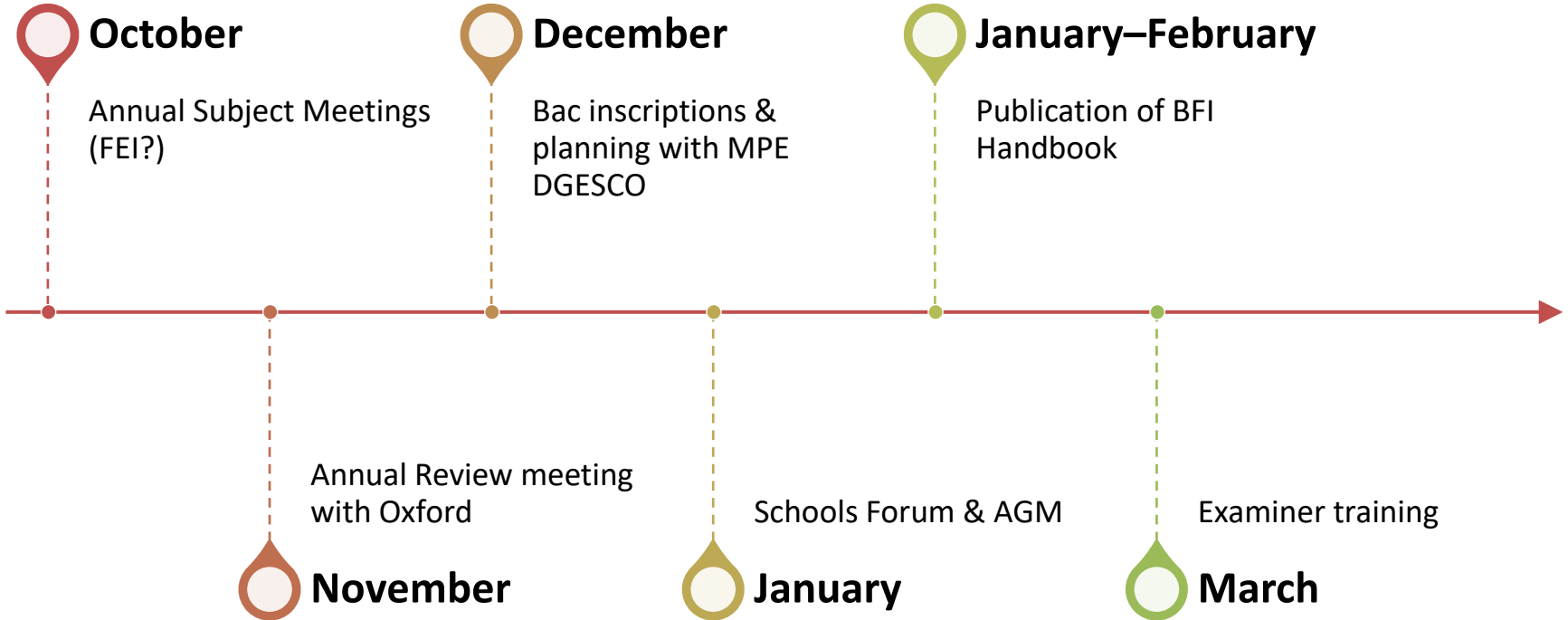

Anastasia Stamatou

Prof. Dr. Anastasia Stamatou is Head of the Bio/tecos Program in Energy and Environmental Systems Engineering at Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts. She studied chemical engineering at the National Technical University of Athens (NTUA), Greece. In 2007 she came to Switzerland to do a Master in Energy Science and Technology at ETH Zurich. From 2008 to 2013 she performed her PhD studies in the Professorship of Renewable Energy Carriers at ETH Zurich on the topic of fuel production using solar thermochemical cycles. In 2014 she joined Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts as a senior researcher in the field of thermal energy storage and since 2017 she is continuing her research activities as a SNSF Ambizione Energy grantee. At the moment she is also guest lecturer and head of the latent heat storage group in the competence centre Thermal Energy Storage (CC TES). Her research interests revolve around material characterization and heat transfer with a focus on latent heat storage. Some examples include the investigation of novel bio-sourced and biodegradable Phase Change Material (PCM) for latent heat storage for high power applications and PCM for thermal management of equipment and processes.

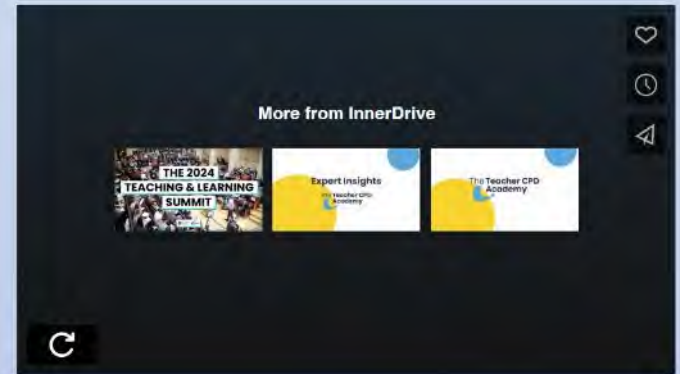

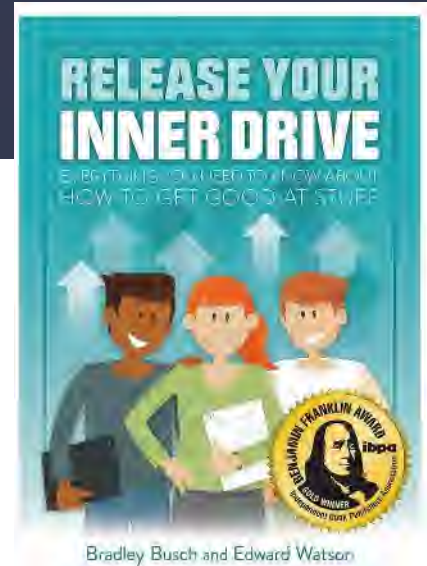

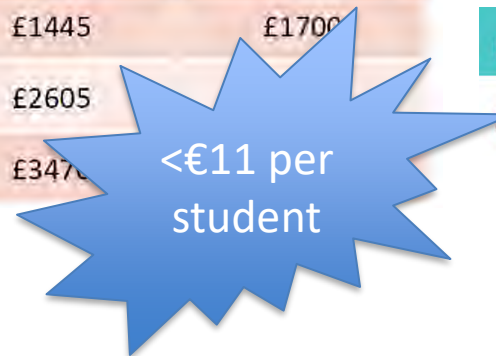

- In 2013, the British and American Sections LISG raised enough money to build six complete libraries – three in Bangladesh and three in India!
- In 2015 the American, British and Danish sections raised a fantastic sum of money which was donated to the Room to Read « Nepal Education Fund» to rebuild schools in the aftermath of the tragic earthquake.
- In 2018 ASIBA schools worked together to raise money to construct a new school, including a new library, to benefit over 600 children.
- In 2019, the donations raised by ASIBA schools helped establish an independent library with 1,282 books in Siripura Primary School in Sri Lanka. Room to Read has also trained a teacher and a librarian in this school and they will greatly benefit the 253 children.
- In 2024, the Lycée International Saint-Germain-en-Laye raised money to build a library in Cambodia



Girl's Education Program

Gender inequality in education remains a significant barrier to girls achieving their full potential in many low-income countries around the world and, right now, 122 million girls are still out of school. Only 66 girls complete upper secondary school for every 100 boys in historically low-income countries. In many countries, secondary school is when girls' enrollment drops sharply due to harmful social and cultural norms. Countries lose over \$1 billion a year by failing to educate girls to the same level as boys. Exclusion from education is especially problematic for young women as it dramatically limits their life options. Without action, the futures of millions of girls stand at a critical tipping point.

€340 can support a girl through an entire year of secondary school with one-on-one mentoring and life skills classes. Your gift will allow us to continue our innovative work improving and promoting the educational prospects of girls and women and, in turn, the quality of their lives.

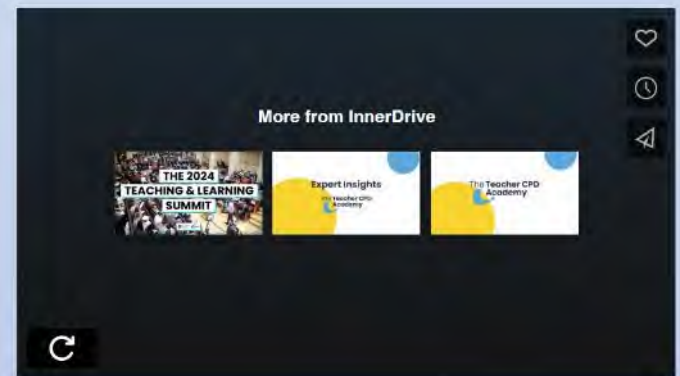

The Baccalauréat Français International (BFI), formerly Option Internationale du Baccalauréat (OIB)

The British version of the BFI is an integrated Franco-British school-leaving qualification based upon a long-standing partnership between the French Ministry of Education and Cambridge International. The unique feature of the BFI is that A-Level style examinations in English Literature, and History-Geography are added to the full syllabus of the traditional French Baccalaureate. All pupils are required to write and speak in an extended analytical mode at university entrance level in English as well as French. The demands of this dual curriculum mean that pupils learn to manage a heavy workload, and acquire different approaches to thinking and methodology through the two languages. This cultural and intellectual flexibility generally enables them to become highly successful undergraduates.
